About creative spaces and self-made arts professionals



Even without formal art training young talent can develop into fully-fledged professionals. Thus proving more and more cultural entrepreneurs are self-taught on the street, through digital media, along with peers or alone. These self-made professionals are not inferior in quality to traditional skilled artists. Yet they are often less visible and are presented or accepted more slowly in the traditional system. How can a self-taught artist create their own professional-quality for yourself and for an approach? And how can a policymaker or cultural institution be creative to create physical space for these self made-art professionals?

On Friday 26th June LKCA, Cultuurmij East and Kunstbedrijf Arnhem are organising **Access for all**, knowledge and networking of creative spaces and non-formal learning in the arts. During the meeting we will present the new toolkit CLOCK for self-taught art professionals. There is also plenty of space to share experiences.
